

Additional information to PhD students:

Target group:

PhD students in PhD programmes at African and Nordic Faculties of Theology, or Schools of Religion and Theology. Also open to PhD students in other relevant programmes, such as Religious Studies, Social Anthropology, Women and Gender Studies. Four PhD students from the School of Religion and Theology at the University of KwaZulu-Natal with projects in masculinity, domestic violence, HIV/Aids, and religious legitimization of violence and abuse are especially invited to participate in this course.

Requirements:

Approximately a 4-6 pages paper draft is to be handed in by 4 May 2010. The subject of the paper has to deal with one or several topics of the seminar in connection with your own project. Each PhD-student will also be required to comment on the paper of another PhD-student. Reading list/literature, approximately 500 pages, will be announced at www.tf.uio.no/bw/ by the end of March 2010.

Deadline for finished papers/ essays: Friday 25 June 2010

Course credits: 3 ECTS for finished essay/ 2 ECTS without essay.
